Report on the Financial Statements

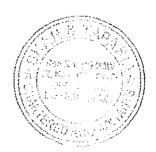

8 Significant Accounting Policies

(a) The Financial Statements are prepared in accordance with Indian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) under historical cost convention on the accrual basis. GAAP comprises mandatory accounting standards as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014, the provisions of the Act (to the extent notified). The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

(b) Basis of Accounting:-

1 All income & expenditure items having a material bearing on the financial statements are recognized on accrual basis.

(c) Use of Estimates:-

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognized in the periods in which the results are known / materialize.

(d) Revenue Recognition:-

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the company and the revenue can be reliably measured. The following specific recognition criteria must also be met before revenue is recongized:

Proceeds from Sales: Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and can be reliably measur. Sales are accounted on dispatch of goods to the customers and net of sales tax, sales returns.

(f) Inventories:-

The Inventories have been valued at Lower of Cost or Net Realizable Value.

(g) Taxation:

Provision for Current Tax is made on the basis of Taxable income for the year. Deferred Tax is recognized, subject to consideration of prudence, on timing differences, being differences between taxable and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent period(s). Deferred Tax assets are not recognized unless there is virtual certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets will be realized.

(h) Earnings Per Share:

The company reports basic and diluted earning per share in accordance with AS-20 "Earning Per Share". Basic earning per share have been computed by dividing net profit after tax by weighted average number of shares outstanding for the year.

(i) Provisions & Contingent Liabilities

A provision arising out of present obligation is recognized when it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation and the amount can be reasonably estimated. Whenever there is a possible obligation that may, but probably will not require an outflow of resources, the same is disclosed by way of contingent liability under "Notes to Accounts".

(j) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash and cash on deposit with banks and corporations. The Company considers all highly liquid investments with a remaining maturity at the date of purchase of three months or less and that are readily convetible to known amounts of cash to be cash equivalents.
